WHAT IS A BLESSING BAG?

Days are getting shorter and that means soon the weather will turn cold. It is time to make up a new Blessing Bag for your car.

What is a Blessing Bag? Why do I need to make one? Who can use a Blessing Bag?

"The King will reply, 'I tell you the truth, whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers of Mine, you did for Me.'

Matthew 25:40

A *Blessing Bag* is a plastic bag filled with items anyone can use such as:

A Bible or gospel tracts, travel size toothbrushes and toothpaste, mouth wash, lotions, tissues, razor, washcloth and soap, deodorant, antibacterial wipes/ointment, band aids, chap stick, Tylenol, safety pens, travel size sewing kits, applesauce, juice box, chewing gum, peanuts, granola bars, crackers (Nabs), tuna in foil packs, water, warm socks, small blankets, a couple of dollars. Just to name a few items. Remember these items need to be portable.

We encourage you to have a *Blessing Bag* made up and carry it in our car (not in the trunk). More people then we know are *homeless* or *in need* of a Blessing Bag. When we start looking, we will begin to see people who can use a bag.

We are so fortunate! We live in warm homes and have plenty of food. Which of the least of our brothers or sisters can we help along the way?

WHAT CAN A PERSON LEARN FROM A STAGE PLAY ABOUT JONAH? Part 2

Last month I told you about a trip Vonnie and I took to Lancaster, PA, where we experienced a wonderful play about the Old Testament prophet Jonah, at the Sight & Sound Theatre. I mentioned that just before the play started, we were told that the theater would add a scene or two NOT included in the Bible, for the purpose of helping the flow of events. But, even then, their goal was to only use "fill in" material that would be consistent with other Biblical truths. Last month I shared one truth I observed from the play, and that was: We offer help to our brothers and sisters simply because they need help. Using the principle taught by Jesus in Matt. 25:40, we don't need a long list of reasons why we should help people – we simply help people because they need help, and...because it's what Jesus would want us to do.

This month let me share with you another principle I saw demonstrated in that play.

At the very end of the book of Jonah, Jonah is upset and puzzled, and he is basically asking God, "WHY?" He is essentially asking this: "Who in the world would be merciful to a group of people (the people in the city of Nineveh) who don't deserve it? Why offer kindness and forgiveness to people who simply don't deserve it?". And, the Sight & Sound people answered that by showing God on the stage with Jonah, and God says, in response to Jonah's question: "I would." So...WHO unilaterally forgiveness and extends mercy? Our Lord does. And, we are exhorted by Scripture to do the same, just as Col. 3:13 and Eph. 4:32 tell us. You and I will never be more like Jesus than when we offer forgiveness to people who don't deserve it, but definitely need it.

Our pastor, David Garrison and his wife, Karey, will be our youth leaders. I can hardly contain myself. Praise GOD for this gift.


I know a lot of you have been praying for a program that will meet the needs of our children as well as the children of our community. We have much to be thankful for and I ask your continued prayer and support for this program.
