**Red Kettle History**


In 1891, Salvation Army Captain Joseph McFee was disturbed because so many poor people in San Francisco were going hungry. During the holiday season he sought a way provide free Christmas dinners for the destitute and poverty-stricken. He only had one problem.....MONEY.

Where would the money come from. He lay awake nights, worrying, thinking, praying about how he could find the funds to fulfill his commitment of feeding 1,000 of the city's poorest on Christmas Day. His thoughts drifted back to his sailor days in Liverpool, England. He remembered how at Stage Landing, where the boats came in, there was a large, iron kettle called "Simpson's Pot" into which passers tossed a coin or two to help the poor. The next day Captain McFee placed a similar pot at the Oakland Ferry landing at the foot of Market Street. Beside the pot he placed a sign saying "Keep the Pot Boiling"

Six years later as the kettle idea spread from the west coast to the Boston area, 150,000 Christmas dinners for the needy were served.

Today in the United States "The Salvation Army" assists more than four-and-a-half million people during the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons.

**FIRST SUNDAY FOOD PANTRY COLLECTION**



On the first Sunday of each month we ask for donations of non-perishables to the Monroe Baptist Church food pantry. Paper products, personal hygiene products and baby-care products are especially welcomed. Your monetary gifts are appreciated as well.

Monroe Baptist pantry operates to serve those in our community qualifying through Amherst County Social Services or recommended by churches. They distribute food on Thursdays.

***More Support for families in need:***

**Neighbors Helping Neighbors** distributes food from their warehouse on Dillard Road each 1<sup>st</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> Saturdays from 10 am – noon. Individuals/families will need to qualify when signing up at this location. Most of the food comes from donations from local grocery stores and churches. October 7 NHN served 98 clients! Including family members, this means 293 people in this community were provided food!


