AFTER THE STORM

Storms are used in fascinating ways in Scripture. Look at Genesis 6-9 (Noah's flood), Psalm 18, and Matthew 8:23-27 (Jesus calms the storm) for a couple of good examples. But my favorite "storm story" is in 1 Kings 19. Elijah has just won a powerful victory over the prophets of Ba'al, but ends up fleeing for his life as Jezebel and Ahab seek vengeance. He hides in a cave on Mount Horeb (also known as Mount Sinai), and God tells him, "Go out and stand on the mountain in the presence of the LORD, for the LORD is about to pass by." What happens next is incredible:



Then a great and powerful wind tore the mountains apart and shattered the rocks before the LORD, but the LORD was not in the wind. After the wind there was an earthquake, but the LORD was not in the earthquake. After the earthquake came a fire, but the LORD was not in the fire. And after the fire came a gentle whisper. When Elijah heard it, he pulled his cloak over his face, went out, and stood at the mouth of the cave.

(1 Kings 19:11-13)

I think most of us would assume that God would've been in the storm, the earthquake or the fire. But He wasn't. God was in the stillness and quiet that came *after* the storm. The same is true with the story of the flood - the rainbow came *after* the waters receded. And when Jesus calmed the waters? That's when the disciples fell down in worship.

"What are you doing here?"

That's the question God asked Elijah in the silence after the storm. Through your tireless acts of love and support, God's presence after the storm has been made real. I have been overwhelmed with the incredible response of our community in the weeks that have followed the tornado in Elon and Lynchburg. You have answered God's question to Elijah with your actions - by faithfully living what Paul calls us to in Galatians 5: "Serve one another in love. The entire law is summed up in a single command: 'Love your neighbor as yourself.'" (Gal 5:13-14) The cleanup work for those affected has just begun and will continue long after the tornado has left the news cycle. May we continue to be God's hands and feet as we pray without ceasing, give as we are able, and serve as the opportunity presents itself. 

After the tornado on April 15 hit our neighbors in the Elon area, we decided the yard sale was a perfect opportunity to provide some support for that community as well as Daystar Jr. School.

At Saturday's Yard Sale, we raised \$1,791. This amount will be split evenly between Daystar School and Elon Strong. On Sunday \$565 more was given to Elon Strong. Therefore, we will be donating \$1,460 to help families in Elon affected by the tornado! Praise God for your generosity.



Combining the money made at the yard sale with other mission funds directed to the Daystar Junior School, we are able to donate \$1,800 to them, allowing them to complete their kitchen

and buy kitchen supplies.

Here is a quote from Nyanzi Jude, the school's director, after learning of the amount of our donation: *"Praise the Lord! God is really amazing and He has surprised us. The glory belongs to Him! I take this opportunity to thank the entire church for the generosity to help the children get a good kitchen. This money will help us even provide stainless saucepans/pans we needed so much.
